Moors Valley Ranger Session

Sun safe nursery

We are officially a sun safe nursery!

Sun Safe Nurseries is the first and only accreditation scheme of its kind to launch in the UK with the key objective to prevent skin cancer through education. The accreditation is a national, annual, scheme developed by Skcin (a skin cancer charity) in conjunction with the Preschool learning alliance. The idea is to introduce sun safe messaging to pre-school children, whilst assisting pre-school settings in implementing a suitable sun safe policy and promoting the reinforcement of sun safety at home.

As a nursery it is our policy is to provide **ALL** children with a sunhat that covers their necks as well as their heads and we provide a factor 30+ sun cream that delivers the required level of UVA and UVB protection. Our garden and outdoor areas provide lots of natural shade where the children are encouraged to spend time when it is hot to keep themselves safe from the sun.

We also provide **ALL** children with a drinking bottle that is topped up with fresh drinking water throughout their day and they are all actively encouraged to drink more during hot weather and especially after outdoor play times.

Staff and adults around are role models to the children and they can be seen applying sun cream, popping on a hat or seeking shade when it's time to go outside. We have adopted a 'Slip, slop, slap' policy and a catchy new song to sing about it too!

Door security!!!

If another parent wishes to enter the building and there is not a member of staff present to identify them, we ask you not to hold the door and let them in, please find a member of staff to come to the door or ask the parent to ring the door bell for attention and close the door as you leave or enter.

Under no circumstances should anyone enter the nursery without a member of staff present.

This is to safeguard and protect your children and we hope that every parent will adhere to this request.

Parent's first aid and life saver training evening

On Tuesday 11th July we are offering parents the opportunity to attend a 2 hour course from 6pm to 8pm in basic first aid and life saver training – specifically focusing on children.
