life and enjoying being at nursery as much as his big sister!




Bugs bugs everywhere

All these activates develop a sense of curiosity and wonder and staff will continue to build on this over the next few weeks.




Sensory play

Sensory discovery is a big part of what we do in The Nest. Opportunities for children to explore using their senses are provided every day in a variety of ways.

Fine motor development



At every opportunity staff continue to develop and promote fine motor skills. I watched as the children patiently put the pieces of the train track together using some amazing co-ordination and fine motor skills.



They are independent souls who really can achieve anything they want to!

Mark making as a group has been a hit. Sitting on the floor and using large chubby crayons and chalks that require the whole palm of the hand to grip have given even the youngest children the opportunity to explore and participate.

It's all been about mark making this month. Large scale and small scale everyone has been having a turn!



Opportunities to paint on a large scale outside has been great fun and the chance to use really large brushes made it quicker to make really big marks and develop the upper body strength needed to make marks.





We have also used dry sand to encourage children to make marks using their fingers or fine brushes and many children have been very clever at trying to make the letters in their names.



Providing opportunities for children to see us write rather than use a mobile device or tablet is really important and we make sure the children see us completing forms and writing notes each and every day.



A few reminders

Door security

When entering or leaving the building can I please ask you to ensure that the door is safely and firmly closed behind you.

If another parent wishes to enter the building and there is not a member of staff present to identify them, we ask you not to hold the door and let them in, please find a member of staff to come to the door.

Sun cream

The nursery provides a Factor 30 sun cream for all the children and this is applied at regular intervals throughout the day. If you wish to supply your own sun cream we ask that you send in with your child so that staff can also reapply this during their day with us.



For very young children the recommendation is to reapply sun cream every 2 hours during sun exposure.
