as the weather allows.










Pumpkins

Fine motor skills

We have been focusing on our fine motor skills this month, something we need to practise to be able to hold a pencil.

Using tweezers the children have had to carefully pick up chick peas and place the correct amount on their number cards. Not only are they working on their physical skills, they are recognising numbers and counting individual objects.
