#### **News from the Nest**

Our youngest children are developing so many new skills, sitting upright, cruising round furniture, walking independently, taking off their own shoes and socks and washing their hands. Their personalities are changing too, and we have had so much delight in watching them grow in confidence and sharing in their smiles and laughter each day.





We continue to love books and rhymes and the children independently choose their favourite puppet from the basket, indicating which rhyme they'd like to sing. They sit beautifully for stories and join in with the ones they know well.

We have explored Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day, and World Book Day so far this year, providing opportunities to explore different resources and experiences.

As we take the babies interests into account, through their play, we see how affectionate they are towards each other. Some have been giving younger ones their comforters if

they see they are upset and offering cuddles too.

We have also been working on boundaries at nursery and reminding the children to be kind to their friends, using kind hands and kind feet.

The children have enjoyed lots of sensory play, exploring using their whole bodies or safely under cover so they don't get messy.







Outside in the garden, they have explored the Orchard and playground, using chalks to make marks, and enjoying the mud kitchen too. We can't wait for sunnier days to be able to spend lots more time outside, where we can enjoy our meals and sleeps in the garden.















#### **News from Plum room**

The children have been exploring the changing seasons, outside splashing in puddles, noticing the daffodils and crocuses flowering in the garden and exploring Spring through stories and books.

The children have enjoyed using their fine motor skills in a variety of ways, learning how to use tweezers to pick up bugs hidden in the sand or using different tools to make marks in paint.









We have explored the colours red and gold for Chinese New Year and even got to see and taste fortune cookies. We absolutely loved World Book Day and some of our friends looked amazing in their costumes. We spent the week sharing stories and rhymes all about colours and some we know so well, the children can predict that words come next.

The children are now making gifts for Mothers Day and staff are planning for Easter.

The staff have followed the childrens interests both inside and outside. Some children have been wanting to use the balls in the garden in a variety of ways, such as playing throwing and catching games or even trying to hit them with a racket.



What a busy start to the year! We have been doing so many different activities, mostly inspired by the chidlren and their interests. We have had lots of time in the Orchard to look at the changing seasons, and the small world area and construction areas have been very popular.

The staff and children celebrated Chinese New Year, the children watched a small clip of a family celebrating the festival in their own country. This inspired some of the children to attempt Chinese writing and make their own Tiger masks and pictures.

The childrens favourite books at the moment are Winnie the Witch and the children have been enjoying exploring the books and the stroies through a variety of activities. One book is all about going into space, so the children enjoyed making a rocket for Winnie.

We have been working on letter formation and shapes, practising fine motor activities to help us with our letter formation. This activities help to build up the muscles in their hands and help them hold and control a pencil.

Out in the Orchard, every opportunity is taken to have a bug hunt and excitement roars across the garden when a 'creature' is found!

We are using the Willow house every day throughout the week and the children have all enjoyed having the opportunity to be out there. The light table has been used daily, mixing colours and talking about light and shadow.

#### Referral reward

Do not forget our referral reward, it is our way of saying thank you to those parents who recommend family, friends, and colleagues to Verwood Day Nursery. The reward will be £100 if the following criteria is met –

- Your name is mentioned at the time of enquiry or booking
- The new child's booking is a minimum of two sessions per week on a full time (51 weeks a year) contract
- The registration form is completed with your name on it as the referrer.

Once the new child has attended Verwood Day Nursery for 3 full months the £100 reward will be credited to your account in the 4<sup>th</sup> month.
